




#### Aim of Patient Involvement in RCFM

#### **OBJECTIVE**

The SPOR Patient Engagement Framework is designed to establish key concepts, principles and areas for patient engagement to be adopted by all SPOR partners.

#### DESIRED OUTCOMES OF PATIENT ENGAGEMENT

Inclusive mechanisms and processes are created Respectful collaboration is established amongst patients, researchers and health care providers

The experiential knowledge of patients is valued as evidence as part of the research process








Initial project on urination when away from home (2010)

HAP-PEE - Challenges in urinating when away from home faced by women with neuromuscular diseases (2019-2023)






# **Perspectives**


RCFM seeks to **obtain patients and relatives' perspective** on all our services, development work and research
